INTRODUCTION:

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS / SUITABILITY:

5 GCSEs at A*-C or Grades 5 - 8. Minimum of B Grade at GCSE in Art, Graphics or Product Design and/or the submission of a strong portfolio.

You'll need to have independence of mind for developing your own ideas, a passion and enthusiasm for art, an experience of working with a variety of mediums and technologies and a good sense of patience and commitment to the course.

CONTENT:

Component 1: Portfolio of practical work showing their personal response to either a starting point, brief or scenario or stimulus, devised and provided by the students / Department

A related study: an extended response of a guided minimum of 1000 words

Component 2: An early release paper will be issued at the beginning of February and will provide learners with a number of themes, each with a range of written and visual starting points, briefs and stimuli

LEADS TO:

Art is required for ... architecture, graphic design, advertising, fashion, teaching, textiles, film making, illustration, sculpture, computer gaming, website design, photography, product design, publishing, animation, CAD, jewellery making, art historian, theatre & staging, exhibition & events, landscaping

Some students apply to universities for degree courses and HNDs while others opt to take a Foundation Course. Here they are able to refine their skills and choose an art specialism later.



ASSESSMENT:

1) Coursework 60% weighting Internally Assessed

2) Set Task 40% weighting Internally Assessed & Externally Moderated 15 hours over 3 day
