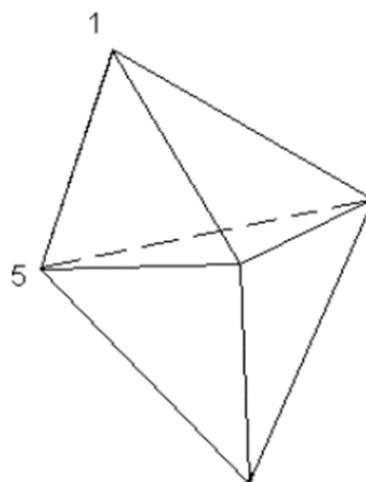
Correct solutions will be awarded points.

LAST WEEK'S NUMERACY SOLUTION

Let's start by looking at the boys and girls separately. There are $5! = 120$ orders in which the girls can bat and there are $5! = 120$ orders in which the boys can bat. Each of the girls orders can pair with each of the boys orders, which means there are $(120)(120) = 14,400$ "pairings" of the boys and girls orders. Additionally, if try to use a "pairing of orders" to create a batting order, we see that the boys can start OR the girls can start which means there are actually $2(14,400) = \mathbf{28,800}$ possible batting orders.

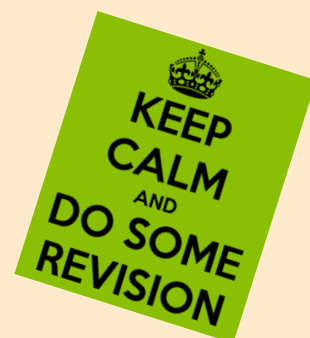

Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a thoroughly busy half-term that has ended on a real high with our Year 10 students being involved in the "Positively Mad experience" and us hosting a coffee morning for parents and carers.

We are also delighted to announce our best GCSE results to date with year 11's from last year improving our Progress 8 score to +0.27. This continues our 4 years of very positive results. Well done to all those students and staff who worked so hard to achieve such fantastic results!

Can I also extend my gratitude to the students who were involved in Open Evening. The students were wonderful ambassadors for the school and we have had lots of positive feedback from our visitors about how polite and mannerly our students are; their enthusiasm and pride in the School and its facilities was plain to see.

School Closure: As we enter this half-term, a reminder about our school closure policy. It is the school's policy to remain open if at all possible as long as we can provide heating, water, meals and a safe environment. However, sometimes emergency action needs to be taken to ensure the health and safety of members of the school community.

Should the need arise to close the school before the start of the school day, information will be posted on the home page of the school website (<http://holytrinity.academy>) by 7.15 am and regularly updated: see the Twitter feed (HTA) – you do not need a Twitter account to be able to access this). This is the simplest and most effective way to communicate messages simultaneously to the whole school.

Information about school closures is also published on the Telford and Wrekin website and on that site, you can also find details of how to sign up (annually) for a free text messaging service.

The need may arise to close the school early but, after students and staff are onsite – eg: as a result of severe weather. We would normally expect students to travel home by their usual means, and would therefore release those who walk home or to the train station as soon as school is closed. All students will be expected to sign out with their tutor if leaving before the end of the usual school day. The buses will generally be called early in these circumstances and students waiting for buses can wait safely in school until their appropriate bus arrives. However, other means of transport home will be considered (eg: lifts with friends) if permission by phone has been granted. Please ensure that your child has emergency contact details for you, and also that the emergency contact details we hold in school are up to date. These can be easily updated by yourselves on the edulink one app.

Senior staff will stay in school until all students have left. We would aim to post information on the school website as soon as practical; and information will certainly be posted on the school website concerning the following school day, whether school is to be open or not.

Any decision to close or open the school is made taking our local context into account. Parents/carers should be aware that if we can open, we will.
