
Cue Cards for Revision



What you need ...



How to make them

- * Write the topic or a question on the front
- * Put the answer in note form on the back



How to make them

*Keep it simple!

- * Use different colours for different points
- Highlight key words
- * Add a picture or a sketch
- * Make several cards for a topic
- * Number the cards



How to revise with cue cards

- * Compiling the cards is revision in itself!
- * Take a pile of cards
- Read all the questions and answers through to refresh your mind
- * Then read the questions / topic heading and try to recall as much info as possible
- * Check your answers.



Alternative ways to revise

- Give your cards to a friend and get them to quiz you
- * Go through your cards and test yourself. Put the cards into 2 piles those you can answer and those you can't. Go back through the second pile again (as in Stage 1) and then divide the pile



Alternative ways to revise

- * Shuffle the pack. Can you do them out of order?
- * Once you think you know the information in your pack, create a second pack of cards with less information on each card. Test yourself again. Can you remember it this time?





Advantages

- Engages active recall
- * Aids spaced repetition
- * Great for self-testing
- * Enhances retention
- * Allows for visual learning
- * Portable
