Wei has twice as many fiction books as non-fiction books. He has 17 more fiction books than non-fiction books. How many books does Wei have in all?







LAST WEEK'S NUMERACY SOLUTION

THE SOLUTION:

We will use a bar diagram to illustrate the situation. We will draw a bar to illustrate the number of red marbles and another bar with equal size to represent the number of blue marbles.



Then we will illustrate the situation when 6 red marbles are removed from the pouch:



Now the number of red marbles is half of the number of blue marbles. That tells us the number of red marbles removed (6) is half of the original number of red marbles. Therefore, the total number of red marbles is 12 and the number of blue marbles is 12.


