

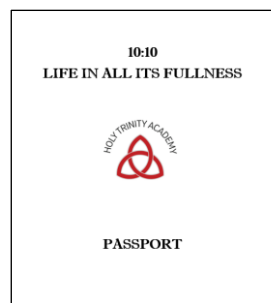
John 10:10 - Life in all its fullness

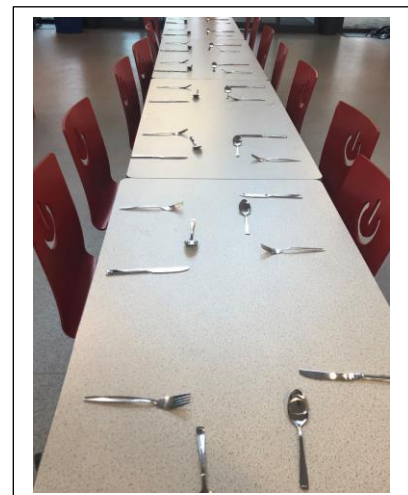
Examples of the activities our students are encouraged to fulfil are:

- Being a House, Form or Sports Captain
- Mentoring other students

Team Work

- Playing an active role in house competitions and sports teams
