TELFORD KNIFE ANGEL 2020 COMPETITION TIME!



The Steer Clear Programme was launched in January 2019 – we engage with children and young people between the ages of 10 to 17 years of age who are on the periphery of knife crime.

To date we have received over 150 referrals from schools, social workers, support workers, foster carers, charities and other organisations within Telford & Wrekin.

Our overall aim is to safeguard and prevent the criminalisation of children and young people. We have strived for our programme to be built by our communities, including the children and young people referred to us. This will include their contribution to our promotional material and website planned for 2020.

In conjunction with the Knife Angel month of March 2020, the Steer Clear Programme are launching an Art Competition!

We require the finest art from your pupils and the assistance of your staff to judge and put forward your school finalist!

Primary schools *YEAR 6 ONLY* - Logo design competition

YEAR 6 PRIMARY SCHOOL LOGO DESIGN

We work with children as young as 10 years of age on our programme and so we want our new logo to appeal to this age group.

All year 6 pupils will be eligible to enter the Logo Design Competition.

Secondary schools - Artwork design competition

SECONDARY SCHOOLS ARTWORK DESIGN

We are looking for an artwork design to use on our promotional material and upcoming website that is appealing and created by young people!

All year 7 to 11 pupils will be eligible to enter the Artwork Design Competition.

THE FOLLOWING GUIDANCE APPLIES TO BOTH COMPETITIONS

We are looking for art that illustrates compassion, community and courage. Here are our reasons as to why we have related these words to our young people's knife crime programme;

COMPASSION - Compassion is empathy and caring in action. Being open to others enables us to face tough times with creativity and resilience. Empathy enables us to connect with people and care for them better.

COMMUNITY - A good community is one where people take pride in their living environment, respecting and supporting one another regardless of age, gender, race or creed. It is somewhere that people wish to stay in and see their children and grandchildren grow up in. It attracts, welcomes and respects outsiders, challenging ignorance and prejudice wherever it arises.

COURAGE – Having the courage to 'do the right thing'. There will be occasions during our lives when we need to make courageous decisions to protect ourselves or other people from harm.









- (1) All artwork must be drawn by hand and submitted on A4 paper.
- (2) The pupil will need to place their name and school on the rear of their work
- (3) Round 1 will take place within participating schools and judged by their own staff
- (4) Only 1 entry per school will be put forward to the final
- (5) Final entries will be judged by an independent panel
- (6) There will be a 1st,2nd,3rd prize for both primary and secondary

Between 24th – 28th February (both primary and secondary) all participating schools will receive a visit from either a member of the Steer Clear Team, Youth Engagement Team or Safer Neighbourhood Team to;

- Announce the school winner who will be put through to the final
- Provide a 10 minute chat about the Steer Clear programme
- Present the winner with their prize

We will require your finalist's artwork submission; this will be collected from you during our visit to present the round 1 prize.

In addition to the finalist, we would really love to have all of the other artwork! These will be displayed during the month of March at Southwater, at the final, and proudly displayed at future events within our borough. THE FINAL ARTWORK SUBMITTED BY ALL PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS (PRIMARY AND SECONDARY) WILL BE SUBMITTED TO OUR PANEL OF JUDGES. The Final will take no longer than 1 hour. During this time we would like to display and show off the great artwork all of our pupils had submitted for the competition. The winners will be presented with their prizes and congratulated by our VIP guests for the event!

Help us deter young people from knife crime

Our team reach out to young people under the age of 18yrs who we believe are most vulnerable to being involved in knife crime and the harm associated with it.

We will strive to educate and support each referred young person whilst tackling knife related crime in order to protect our communities from harm.














Knives **Know the facts**

Carrying a knife, it's your choice.

If you have a criminal record you might not be accepted into a college or university, get a job, or travel to some countries like USA, Canada or Australia.

Possession of a knife carries a prison sentence of up to 4 years even if it's not used.

There is no 'safe place' to stab someone. Get stabbed in the heart and you can loose all of your blood in one minute. But a wound in the arm or the leg can still kill and young people have died from wounds to the leg because an artery was severed.

If you stab somebody and they die, you'll face a life sentence and serve a minimum of 25 years.

Knife crime can affect anyone, not just people in gangs. Innocent bystanders can get caught in the middle of other people's disputes and suffer trauma, serious injuries or worse.

It's illegal to carry a knife or offensive weapon in a public place without a reasonable excuse. Reasonable excuses include those who need them for work, like fishermen or carpet fitters, but this only applies while they're actually at work.

Even if it's not you who does it, if someone is injured or killed by a knife in your presence you could be sent to prison for murder or attempted murder in what is referred to as 'joint enterprise'.

Police can, and do, stop and search anyone they think is carrying a weapon.

By carrying a knife, you are much more likely to get stabbed yourself as situations involving weapons can quickly get out of control.

If you are caught with a knife, it doesn't matter if it was for your own protection or you were carrying it for someone else - you will be arrested and prosecuted. Self-protection is not a reasonable excuse for carrying an offensive weapon.

Knives are the most common weapons used in killings of young people.
