
But Mary was very confused by what the angel said. Mary wondered, "What does this mean?"



Mary said, "I am the servant girl of the Lord. Let this happen to me as you say!" Then the angel went away.
















Reflection [Service Leader: Fr Michael]




Scripture Reading [Pupil 3]:
























Reflection [Service Leader: Rev Lisa]

And glory shone around























Reflection: [Mr Doust]
