

INTRODUCTORY PRAYER (Read by Mr Doust)

FIRST READING (Mrs Welsh) "The Secret of Happiness"

I'd like to share with you some words of John Paul II, spoken to young people and families in 1985 and 1987. They contain the secret of happiness according to one of the greatest world leaders of all time:

"The path of goodness has a name; it is called love. In it we can find the key to every hope, for true love has its root in God himself. As St John reminds us 'we have recognised for ourselves, and put our faith in, the love God has for us. God is love.'

The greatest proof of God's love is that he loves us in our human condition, with our weaknesses and needs. Nothing else can explain the mystery of the Cross. Christ's love is more powerful than sin or death.

St Paul explains that Christ came to forgive sins and that his love is greater than any sin whatever, greater than my sins and those of anyone else. This is the Church's faith. This is the Good News of God's love, which the Church has proclaimed down the ages and which I proclaim to you today: God loves you with an everlasting love. He loves you in Christ Jesus his Son. Loving is essentially a giving of oneself to others, a conscious decision of the will to go out to others. To be able to love properly one must give freely. This is the secret of happiness."

SECOND READING (Read by Mr Doust)
