# What is Health and Social Care?

- '*Health care*' will obviously incorporate staying healthy and remaining without infection or diseases
- People who work in health care are normally looking after patients who have, or may have, a medical problem.



# What is Health and Social Care?

- ‘*Social care*’ describes the activities, services and relationships that help people to be independent, active and healthy.

# What will you do?

## Component 1: Controlled Assessment

- This Component helps you understand how people grow and develop, as well as the personal relationships people have during their lives.
- You will look at how people progress from birth right through to later adulthood.
- You will complete a Controlled Assessment on growth and development for 2 life stages set by BTEC under exam conditions but within Y10 lesson time.



# What will you do?

## Component 2: Controlled assessment

In this unit you will study and practically explore health and social care services and how they meet the needs of real people.

You will also look at the Care Values, there are seven and how these can be demonstrated.



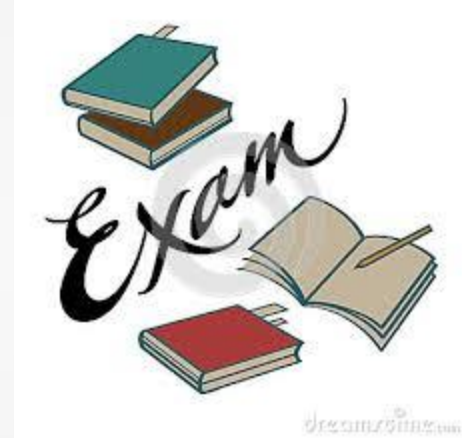
- You will complete a Controlled Assessment under exam conditions but within Y11 lesson time. Written assignment work for this Component and analyse a role play of care values.

# Year 11

## Component 3; Exam

- You will study the factors that affect health and wellbeing.
- You will learn about physiological disorders and lifestyle indicators.
- You will also learn how to design a health and wellbeing improvement plan to include short and long-term targets



- This Component builds on the knowledge, understanding and skills you gained from Components 1 and 2.
- This is a 2 hour exam taken in May/June Y11
